This week.....

It has been another jammed pack week full of fun learning experiences for the children.

Class 1 and 2 have been learning about the Great Fire of London. This week they recreated London Bridge and set light to the bakery. The children had first hand experience of how quickly the fire spread between houses and how the proximity of the houses to each other allowed it to speed so quickly and easily. I was very impressed that a number of children were able to identify what was needed for a fire to occur. A special shout out to Kayden in year 1 who could tell me that a fire needs oxygen!

Class 3 and 4 had a leading Archaeologist visit them, Dr Ian Parker Heath. The children discovered about how archaeologists learn about the past through their different methods and tried themselves to be archaeologists for the day!

Class 5 had great fun during their Evacuees Day on Tuesday. They arrived at school looking fantastic having thrown themselves whole heartedly into creating costumes suitable for evacuees. During the day they learned about Leicester's Blitz, what rationing meant and how to do the Lambeth Walk. They were then tasked with cooking cakes and biscuits using only ingredients available during the war. The chocolate cake was the clear favourite. They also learned about Anderson shelters and how they protected many families during the bombing before making their own replica shelters. Test your child's recall by seeing if they can answer these three learning questions.

- 1. When did rationing start and finish?
- 2. Name 6 things which were rationed and 3 things which weren't.
- 3. Why was rationing necessary?
