Previous Learning: building on pupils' knowledge of tempo, dynamics and rhythm.

Next step: experimenting with pitch and tempo using notation and writing a melody.

Rhythm	A pattern of long and short notes.
Layers	The different instruments, rhythms or melodies that build the overall texture.
Melody	An arrangement of notes which sound tuneful.
Dynamics	The volume of the music (loud or quiet).
Timbre	The quality of sound e.g. smooth, scratchy, twinkly.
Pitch	How high or low a sound is.
Verse	A repeated section of a song that usually has different words (lyrics) each time it is repeated.


Instrumenta



Tips for performing



Smile and sit smartly



Keep your hands to yourself



Start and stop playing at same time



Be silent at the beginning and at the end of performance



Play at the same speed and volume
