

<b>Cartoonist</b>	An artist who makes a series of drawings or illustrations.
<b>Character</b>	A description of a person.
<b>Minimal</b>	A very simple design without many colours.
<b>Opaque</b>	A solid surface which you cannot see through.
<b>Puppet</b>	A doll moved by your hand or strings.
<b>Sketching</b>	A fast, light drawing which is often made as a plan for a drawing or painting.
<b>Style</b>	The way in which something has been drawn.
<b>Three dimensional</b>	A solid object, with height, length and width.
<b>Tint</b>	The adding of white to make a colour lighter.
<b>Tone</b>	The lightness and darkness of a colour.

Cartoons tell a story and do not always have to be funny.

It helps to draw cartoons in a simple and minimal style.




