


# The Pochin School



### Safeguarding at The Pochin School

At the Pochin School the health, safety and well-being of every child is our top priority. We expect all staff, governors and volunteers to share this commitment to safeguarding our pupils.

We listen to our pupils and take seriously what they tell us. All school staff are trained in Child Protection, and children are made aware of the adults they can talk to if they have any concerns. Staff are trained to look out for signs of physical/emotional harm or neglect and are required to report these to the Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL).

With the pandemic effecting many of our children's mental health it is vital as a school that we work closely with parents to support our children as soon as signs are presented.

Sometimes as a school we may have to have a difficult conversation with parents. These conversations are vital in supporting pupils and families. The school makes all efforts to help families feel comfortable during the meetings.

Mrs Sharpe is the school's Designated Safeguarding Leader, she is also supported by deputies, Mrs Southwell, Miss Evans and Mrs Holmes.

### Year 6 Wintery Poems


Is I were winter, I would spread each house with a silk sheet of snow as if it was a blanket.
