Easter Church Service – Tuesday 5th April

- The Easter Church Service is for main school pupils only (Class 1 Class 5). Preschool will have the opportunity to watch a shortened recorded version of the service during the day.
- All children must be dropped of at Barkby's St Mary's Church between 8:30- 8:45am
- All children must be in full school uniform
- Children who attend 'Before School Club' will be escorted to the church
- There will be no 'Kiss and Drive' drop off service that day
- When children arrive at the church they will be shown where to put their bags and then they go and register with their teacher and sit with their class
- Parents are encouraged to stay for the service. We do ask parents to bring activities to keep their younger children quiet throughout the service, so the school children are able to present their talks and songs with reduced distractions that might impact on their performance.
- Parents are asked to remain seated at all times throughout the service unless asked to stand
- All children should have been to the toilet before coming to church.
- At the end of the performance we ask parents to remain seated (if they do not need to quickly rush off to work) as the children get their coats and bags and give their children a little wave as they leave to go back to school
- Parking is always difficult during church service times. The Pochin Family kindly open up their courtyard for school parking. We also ask that parents are respectful of all residents and not to block anyone in. PLEASE AVOID PARKING ON THE BRIDGE ON BARKBY HOLT LANE AS THIS PREVENTS THE EMERGENCY SERVICE VEHICLES FROM BEING ABLE TO ACCESS HOMES ON THE BROOKSIDE AND FARMS.
