Instead of the Afternoon Tea in the village hall for all pupils after sports day, the school will hold a family picnic on the cricket field. Children once collected from their teacher after the sports day can enjoy a family picnic. Parents can also purchase drinks, food and Cream Teas from the PTA for this event. For pupils whose parents have not come for sports day or are at after school club, staff will sit down together with them and have a picnic.

We hope the above changes to the Sports Day will bring greater union of classes, house teams, families and the school community together. We also anticipate the children will have an enhanced experience as they participate in all sports events and share the fun afterwards with their families and friends at the picnic celebrating their wins and the fun of taking part!



Children's Car Safety

- Avoid parking in places which restrict the views of other road users and pedestrians.
- Always try and ensure children get into and out of the car on the side of the road where the pavement is. If unavoidable ensure children get in safely.
- · Ensure children have their seat belts on before driving.

The Law - with few exceptions, all children under 12 years and under 135cm tall must use an appropriate child restraint when travelling in any car or goods vehicle.

- All children under 3 years old must use an appropriate child restraint when travelling in any car or goods vehicle (except in the rear of a taxi if a child seat is not available).
- Children aged 3 or more years old, and up to 135cm (approx 4ft 5in) tall, must use an appropriate child restraint when travelling in cars or goods vehicles fitted with seat belts. A few exceptions are permitted.
- The driver is responsible for seat belt wearing and restraint use by children under 14 years. This is for the safety of everyone in the car, and the penalty for offenders is a £100 fixed penalty notice.
