Dear Parents, Governors and Friends,

This week has been busy at school. It is nice to see all the classes working hard and our afterschool sports clubs starting again. Our new children in class 1 have become very grown up and come into school very sensibly and gone into their new class in the morning with very little support needed from siblings or staff. Next week we know they are going to be very grown up as they enter the school like other pupils independently in the morning.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank parents who have supported the school in keeping the roads clear in front of the school to ensure the safety of all pupils at key points in the school day. Also, the opening-up of the school gates early has meant there is not a dangerously large queue outside the school gates by the side of the road and children and parents are making good use of the space in the school playground. I have celebrated this success of the children's behaviour in assembly today.

All children in school should now have received their homework packs and a reading book at the appropriate level. Can I please encourage parents to support their children with their homework. This might mean that you encourage your child to do it at a set time each week (my children always did it at the dinner table after the dinner dishes were cleared away), support them in reading the activity, testing them on their spellings, checking in with them that they have completed all tasks, or ensuring that they are reading daily. **We require all children to be heard being listened to reading on a daily basis, this ensures that all children make good progress in their reading ability which opens the door to the world!** Can all parents please ensure they sign their child's reading books and homework packs on a daily/weekly basis.
