


The Pochin School Newsletter 11th November 2022




The Pochin School Parking Code of Conduct

This code of conduct has been introduced to ensure the safety of all of us, especially the children. It should also help in the efforts of the school to be a good neighbour to the local community. Below are a series of points that should be observed by all people parking outside the school. If someone other than yourself collects your child/children, please make them aware of this code of conduct.

- Do not park in the Kiss and Drive area in the mornings.
- Do not park or drop children off on the zig zag lines.
- Do not reverse into School Lane or up the Village Hall driveway.
- Do not park on School Lane.
- Do not turn or park in front of residents' driveways.
- Do not park in front of gates leading into fields.
- Do not park on the corner of School Lane and Beeby Road or Barkby Holt Lane and Beeby Road.
- Do not park on the bridge on Barkby Holt Lane
- Do not park on Brookside on the grass parking bays by the first bridge, this is a resident's private parking bay.
