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Sentence structure and phrases

The currency used in France is the Euro.

In French, the price of something is shown with the € symbol and a comma to separate Euros and cents. The Euro symbol can go before or after the price
€6,40 / 6,40 €

six Euro, quarante

six Euros and forty cents

Je vais au marché et j'achète des pommes, des bananes et des raisins

I go to the market and I buy some apples, some bananas and some grapes

Il a faim.
Il mange de la soupe

He is hungry.
He eats some soup

Il a tout mangé !

He has eaten everything!

Elle mange du poulet et des chips

It's delicious!
