Reading for Pleasure

Great books build the imagination. The more we read aloud expressively, and the more children are able to savour, discuss and reinterpret literature through the arts, the more memorable the characters, places and events become, building an inner world.

The following books have been carefully selected for teachers to share with their classes as they provide the opportunity for the children to learn about the lives of those whose experiences and perspectives differ from their own. Choosing stories and non-fiction that explore such differences begins to break down a sense of otherness that often leads to division and prejudice.


The children from each class can choose the book that they would like the teacher to read aloud and this is done through a democratic vote encompassing one of our key British Values.

It is imperative that the children are read to for 15 minutes per day. This should take place before or after lunch because at the end of the day it can fall off the timetable.

The class novel should be challenging. The children should be able to access it, but it should be a text that many of the class could not sit and read independently cover to cover. Only the class teacher should read the class novel so that children get the best understanding to develop reading for pleasure.

The aim of this reading spine is to expose the children at The Pochin School to a variety of different books, expand their vocabulary and strengthen their comprehension leading to independence and confidence in reading.

Class 1








Charlie McGuffin has an incredible secret .




Welcome to The Nothing to See Here Hotel! A hotel for magical creatures, where weird is normal for Frankie Banister and his parents who run the hotel.



Theme: Stone Age to Iron Age




Theme: Mountains

Theme: Anglo-Saxons



The tales relate the adventures of several animal friends and neighbours in the English countryside—primarily Mole, Rat, Toad, and Badger.




Theme: Rainforests






Theme: Crime and Punishment






Theme: Earth and Space

Class 5







Marinka dreams of a normal life, where her house stays in one place long enough for her to make friends. But her house has chicken legs and moves on without warning.






Theme: Mayans and Aztecs



Except, it seems, someone has been there before them.




Theme: World War II




Theme: Circulatory System
