There is a lot of events going on in school over the coming month - more than originally planned - in the run up to the Christmas holidays!




2nd December - Decorations Day Children and staff to decorate the classrooms etc.

6th December - Class 1 and 2 at The Curve Theatre to see Pirates Love Underpants!






6th December - The Pochin School Festive Market


